Re: Frank v. Her Majesty the Queen


I am writing to you further to our conversations of this week and last with respect to information that you are seeking from Elections Canada. You have asked us to look for any complaints that Elections Canada may have received about electors who reside outside of Canada being permitted to vote in federal elections. Division 3 of Part 11 of the *Canada Elections Act* permits electors who have resided outside the country for less than five years to vote by mail-in ballot. Alternately, electors who reside outside of Canada may vote at the advance polls or on polling day if they are in Canada at that time.

There are four different sources at Elections Canada for records that may be pertinent to your request. Even though special voting rules for electors registered on the international register have existed since 1993, the oldest records in Elections Canada's possession about this program date from 2003. We have finished searching two of the sources and are currently searching the other two. We expect to finish the third search at the beginning of next week, but the fourth search may take a number of additional days.

Our searches to date have uncovered no complaints objecting to the fact that electors who have lived abroad for five years or less receive a ballot by mail and can vote from abroad or about the fact that electors who reside outside of Canada may vote at federal elections. Furthermore, officials at Elections Canada responsible for the special voting rules cannot recall such a complaint ever having been made.

I trust the above is satisfactory.
